



Community stakeholders represent the strongest Corporate Reputation Index (82), while Paying Port Users represent the weakest Corporate Reputation Index at 45.




Stakeholder perception survey




Trade throughput by commodity






Trade throughput by industry

Half Tide Tug Harbour steps









Engagement Goals – Port of Mackay 80th

Event Objectives
