NQBP ORGANISATIONAL STRUCTURE CHANGES



- Dec 2021 Feb 2022 NQBP reviewed organisational structure
- **Feb 2022** new structure introduced:
 - Commercial (replacing Trade & Marine Operations and expanded to incorporate Communications)
 - Infrastructure (replacing Infrastructure & Land Operations and expanded to incorporate Environment and Sustainability)
 - **Corporate Services** (replacing Legal, People and Governance and expanded to include Safety)
 - **(Unchanged) Chief Financial Officer** Finance, Procurement, Risk & Assurance, and Information

TRADE UPDATE



Port of Mackay - Total throughput 2.44M (financial year to date)

Continuing flexibility

- Bulk tanker Chang Hang Xing Yun (CHXY) recently berthed at all three of the Port of Mackay wharves capable of receiving fuel to accommodate shipping schedules.
- Only the second time one vessel has visited three locations in Mackay.

Proposed Port of Hay Point hydrogen trade

- NQBP, DBI, Brookfield and ITOCHU Corporation announced Funding Agreement for feasibility studies associated with development of Dalrymple Bay Hydrogen Project.
- Funding demonstrates a commitment to progress the green hydrogen project.

PORT PROJECTS UPDATE



Tug berth facility

- \$8.5M project will include berths for up to two tugs including a gangway and floating pontoon.
- Additional \$375,000 for two pilot boat berths.
- Current status Tug berth gangway and pontoon completed. Two additional pilot boat berths to be completed.
- Donut fender delivery delayed from United States.
- Contractor Pacific Marine Group has demobilised from site, but will return to complete project in April 2022.
- Estimated completion May 2022.



The tug berth gangway and pontoon has been completed on the new tug berth facility project.

PORT PROJECTS UPDATE



Water network upgrade

- \$1.7M upgrade project awarded to Roebuck Civil
- \$~2M additional water booster pump station
- Works progressing, completion
 September 2022.

Wharf 5 western access trestle replacement

- \$4.2M upgrade project awarded to V2R Projects.
- Construction underway, completion ~June 2022.
- Some shipping may move to Wharf 1 (e.g. scrap metal).



Works on the Water Network Improvement project have been progressing.



Southern Breakwater guardrail replacement

- Current status Works underway
- Replacement of corner guardrail for breakwater, reached end of life.
- 2 week closure of the Southern Breakwater to vehicle traffic during the project, pedestrian and cyclist access remains.
- Traffic management and temporary fencing in place.
- Work hours between 0630 and 1500 during week days.
- No heavy machinery being used, noise impact to local businesses and residents to be minimal.

Biodiversity assessment of port infrastructure

- Enables understanding of port infrastructure value i.e. how artificial habitats add to ecosystems and compare with natural local habitats.
- Preliminary data has revealed interesting insights into fish behaviour, and oyster/coral habitats.


