



Community stakeholders represent the strongest Corporate Reputation Index (82), while Paying Port Users represent the weakest Corporate Reputation Index at 45.




Stakeholder perception survey

Total Residents Corporate Reputation Index is 69. This is stronger than Tier 2 Stakeholders (57) and slightly weaker than Tier 1 Stakeholders (72). Residents living in Bowen and Weipa have a stronger score.

- High trust rating.
- Stakeholders and residents recognise that NQBP makes a considered effort to engage and collaborate.
- Environmental management rated as strong by stakeholders.
- Cowboys partnership has a significant, positive impact on reputation.

Opportunities for Improvement

- Providing efficient shipping and marine services and responding to issues in a timely manner.
- Planning for future growth and development of ports.
- Provide improved transparency in relation to financial management.
- Strong environmental management not getting broader recognition by residents, who rate it as their highest priority in driving a stronger Corporate Reputation.



Trade throughput by commodity



Trade throughput by industry



Edmund Casey extension update



- NQBP is planning to extend Edmund Casey Drive to Slade Point Road to:
 - a) provide a secondary Port emergency evacuation route
 - b) improve safety of traffic along Spiller Avenue
 - c) allow access from Slade Point Road into North Wall beach
 - d) unlock development of commercial lots in Northern parts of the Port (Area 1)
- Design reviewed and approved by Department of Transport and Main Roads.
- Contract award is imminent. Contactor is Queensland based. Majority of subcontractors and suppliers are Mackay based.
- Construction commences late September, starting from Spiller Ave side. Completion is expected by early 2020.
- Full communications plan has been developed and will be rolled out over the next few months.
- Communication materials already distributed:
 - PortLife article letterbox dropped to Slade Point residents and in Daily Mercury
 - PortLife uploaded onto NQBP website
- Communication materials under development:
 - Fact sheet for letterbox drops
 - Video updates, press advertisements, social media updates and media interviews






Potential fishing platform meeting update

Meeting objectives were:

- For NQBP to gain an understanding of the Mackay CRG's thoughts and preferences on a potential fishing platform in the Mackay Harbour area including:
 - Preferred locations
 - Suggested layout/type/make
 - Suggested attributes/features
 - Suggested number of people to be accommodated
 - Minimum requirements for services
- Fact finding and information finding exercise.
- Information from meeting was to be collated and presented to tonight's CRG meeting.
- Minutes of the meeting were taken and sent to CRG members on 4 July 2019. No major changes identified.





Potential fishing platform meeting update

Actions from the meeting:

Q: Why is the very end of the Southern Breakwater is not publicly accessible?A: Vehicles are unable to turn around effectively in this area, and the interface with pedestrians also increases safety risk.

Q: Would a potential fishing platform would be eligible for NDRRA funding if damaged? A: Unlikely as the Southern Breakwater itself isn't eligble.

Q: Can we please include map of secure zones to help illustrate no-go areas for this meeting A: See previous slide.



Potential fishing platform meeting update

Summary of meeting:

Ideally the CRG would prefer fishing platforms that:

- Are family friendly
- Are easy to access for everyone
- Are close to car parking/facilities
- Are located between areas B and C, or along area D
- Are either a stepped access or a fixed or floating pontoon
