4. NQBP update	 Presented by Chair and NQBP CEO Nicolas Fertin An overview of NQBP's Vision, Mission, Values and Strategic Themes was provided. An overview of NQBP's FY 2020-21 highlights including throughput totals was given. NQBP's recent MOU signing for a feasibility study to export hydrogen from Hay Point discussed. 	



5. NQBP trade and marine operations update	 Presented by Chair and NQBP CEO Nicolas Fertin Trade results for Mackay discussed. 2020-21 saw massive growth – 70% for break bulk cargo at the Port of Mackay – from 68,138 tonnes in 2021-22 to a total of 164,449. August was a record trade month for Mackay. 	
6. NQBP infrastructure and land operations update	Presented by General Manager Infrastructure and Land Operations, Tim Lewis Port projects update S2.5 million Wharf 1 project is complete. Will allow facilitation of longer cargo. Mount Bassett landscaping has now been completed. Future projects include: Water network upgrade – aims to rectify issues with water pressure within the Port. Fuel pipeline relocation. Wharf 5 upgrade, western access trestle will be replaced. Southern Breakwater – safety barrier replacement project will be undertaken in the next few months.	
7. Sustainability and environment update	 Presented by Director Environment, Kevin Kane NQBP and James Cook University (JCU) are conducting biodiversity assessments around NQBP ports. This will enable us to understand the value that port infrastructure provides. For example, how artificial habitats add to regional ecosystems and compare with natural local habitats. Research underpins a larger biodiversity assessment of port infrastructure being completed in partnership with DBI, BMA and JCU. 	
8. Community update	 Presented by Senior Advisor Community Relations, Amanda Blines The 10,000 steps project is now complete. Thanks to the CRG members who took part in the unveiling. Aluminium signs have also been installed in addition to the floor stickers to ensure longevity. Recent media for NQBP at Mackay and Hay Point included the MOU hydrogen announcement, 10,000 steps project and the Wharf 1 completion. In 2020-21, NQBP has granted more than \$110,000 to 40 initiatives across its four port communities. Major sponsorships included Mackay Marina Run, Mackay Tourism Visitors Guide and NAIDOC Week. 	 More than \$1.2 million has been invested in this Port Communities Program over the last ten years. CRG members were provided an outline of the CRG grants program. More information will be sent to CRG members before the next meeting so that members can nominate projects to be considered. 	
9. General	Jason Britton, Regional Harbour Master, Maritime Safety Queensland	
Business	 Multi-agency response to deceased birds recently found within the Mackay marina area. There was no oil spill at the Port of Mackay. Investigations continue into the cause. There have been several safety concerns raised recently around recreational vessel and ship interaction at the Port. MSQ, NQBP and the tug providers Smit Lamnalco are working on an education program for boaties to encourage safe behaviour. Pilots have been using the ship's horns more frequently coming into and out of port if they need to send a warning to recreational vessels in their path. The pilot vessel will now have the ability to operate the traffic lights so they will be turned on and off in real time. Jason encouraged members to spread the safe boating message to their contacts. Jason encouraged CRG members to consider having their COVID-19 vaccinations and seek advice from their GPs. 	ACTION – QSHIPS link to be sent to CRG members
