Priority port master planning



- Department of Transport and Main Roads (TMR)
 is leading priority port master planning for North
 Queensland ports of Hay Point/Mackay and Abbot
 Point working closely with NQBP, local
 governments, and other key stakeholders
- Public consultation: 17 Oct 2022 20 Jan 2023
- TMR reviewing and considering content of submissions
- After all views raised through consultation process have been considered, draft master plan will be updated for finalisation

Informing intention to prepare or amend a priority port master plan

A notice of proposal:

- is issued by the Minister to the port authority and local government at the priority port
- ▶ formally initiates the master planning process under the Sustainable Ports Development Act 2015
- enables each entity to make an early submission about the proposal to prepare a master plan.



Master plan preparation

Evidence based planning provides a balanced and objective approach to:

- inform the preparation of the master plan by analysing the economic, environmental, and social factors relevant to the priority port, including the OUV of the GBRWHA
- identify long-term infrastructure, supply chain, and port development requirements
- undertake an assessment of the regulatory framework to understand how impacts from development will be sustainably managed.



Master planning

The master plan is a strategic document that:

- outlines the role and function of the port and factors to manage sustainable growth
- states the long-term strategic vision, outcomes, and objectives for the master planned area
- establishes land and marine precincts within the master planned area
- identifies environmental values, potential impacts, and how impacts are managed.

Port overlay

Implementing the master plan

The port overlay is the statutory instrument that:

- adopts a regulation by exception approach to implement the master plan
- states how priority management measures will be achieved
- operates alongside existing planning instruments to achieve the outcomes of the master plan.



Reviewing the master plan

The Ports Act requires the master plan be reviewed at least every ten years to assess changes since the first master plan was made including:

- the boundaries of the master planned area
- the effectiveness of the implementation of the priority management measures.

Trade update



Port of Mackay - Total throughput 2,070,495 (financial year to date)

January 2023

- Stronger performance than expected in January, handling a total of 292,562t of cargo - a 13% increase year on year
- Grain has had a good season with throughput up significantly

Port of Hay Point

- January 2023 throughput was ~7Mt 19% below budget for the month
- Cyclone Ellie caused major disruptions to coal supply chains.
- Market intel suggests demand for Australian coal may increase with recent easing of China's informal ban but not at volumes seen before trade dispute.

Cruise ships



NQBP is taking part in a working group to attract cruise ships to the Port of Mackay

Mackay Isaac Tourism is leading the working group

- Site visit conducted at the Port of Mackay with Mackay Tourism, MSQ and NQBP in late 2022.
- Port of Mackay is able to cater to cruise ships.
- First meeting with broader stakeholders held in late February 2023.
- Aim: Assess feasibility of cruise ships for the Mackay Region and if feasible create a long-term strategy.

Port projects



Middle Breakwater common user pipeline support replacement

Status: Tender award imminent.

- Relocation of fuel, ethanol and water pipe infrastructure.
- Provides greater resilience against storm and cyclone exposure.
- Unlocks area to the West of Wharf 1 for future development.
- Completion expected by end of FY23.
- Budget: ~\$7 million.

Port projects



Wharf 5 electrical upgrade

Status: Tenders close 22 March

- Replacement and upgrade of electrical infrastructure supplying Wharf 5.
- Includes new cabling, cable trays, switches.
- Inclusion of switchboard room fire monitoring system.
- Completion by mid-FY24.
- Budget: ~\$700,000.

Old Mulherin Park



- NQBP has taken back management of Old Mulherin Park from Mackay Regional Council.



Port Binnli / Mackay Marina nib wall



- NQBP has given control of the Southern Breakwater to Port Binnli and Halls Contracting.
- Construction started early March.
- Works to take several months.
- Disruption to public access.
- Community events (e.g. Marina Run) to go ahead as normal.
- Mackay Marina handling communication and public enquiries.




First truckload of rock unloaded for the construction of the Mackay Marina nib wall.

Southern Breakwater update



- Speed Monitoring Awareness cameras installed on Southern Breakwater.
- Jan and Feb 2023 data shows 99% of movements are under speed limit (98.98%).
- Total of 46,518 movements recorded (incoming and outgoing).
 - 46,046 under 40km/hr
 - 283 between 41-60km/hr
 - 4 between 61-80km/hr
- 3 out of 4 instances over 61km recorded between 7.30pm and 10.30pm.
- Encourage community members to continue to report incidents to Policelink 131 444.

Seagrass restoration



- JCU TropWATER scientists, NQBP, and Ports North leading one of Australia's most promising seagrass restoration projects
- To research ways to restore key tropical seagrass species and design tool for coastal managers to rapidly restore seagrass meadows in high-priority areas
- Four-year project
- Also funded by Federal Government Australian Research Council

Sand mining / replenishment



- Sand mining occurs on Reserve Tenures that exist on NQBP's Strategic Port Land (SPL).
- Three (3) operators holding sand extraction permits in the Northern Reserve in addition to NQBP.
- Department of Agriculture and Fisheries (DAF) issue the permits to extract and sell the sand.
- Department of Environment and Science (DES) regulate the activity.
- Historical agreement of 'like for like' replacement of sand from Northern Reserve to North Wall carpark dune.
- NQBP seeking further advice from DES, review of approvals, aerial mapping and science to confirm tangible results and future action.

Beach clean ups / debris



- Significant debris at North Wall Beach and Harbour Beach.
- Due to severe weather events.
- MSQ responsible for removal of 'flotsam'.
- Mackay Regional Council responsible for all other debris and management of beach (Unallocated State Land).
- NQBP has worked with MSQ and Roadtek to remove unnatural debris from Harbour Beach.
- North Wall Meeting with Mackay Turtle Watch – no further debris removal required.
- Harbour Beach NQBP attempted to coordinate a response with Mackay Surf Life Saving Club, however, Council will not approve/support.




