Brendan welcomed new Directors and continuing Director Monica McKendry.

	North Wall Recreational Area	
	 Thank you to all the CRG members who were able to attend the official opening in October. 	
	Stage 2 planning underway: this will include a 130m revetment wall and improved beach access (including emergency response). The design process is about to kick off, construction targeted for late 2026 pending tidal works approvals.	
	NQBP participated in Great Barrier Reef Clean Up on 18 Oct at North Wall with Mackay Regional Council and Save Our North Wall group; small amount of rubbish collected.	
	Southern Breakwater update	
	 NQBP has made further progress on the action items for the Southern Breakwater. This includes working closely with Mackay Regional Council on road reserve access and relevant design codes. 	
	Discussions continue to find practical solution for all stakeholders.	
	 The update included estimated costs and timings on the proposed safety controls while acknowledging it has been a lengthy process due to the complexities of issues. 	
	CRG member Rod Moffat provided an update. He engaged the Qld Police Minister at Community Cabinet, follow-up discussions underway on issues including policy reform, fixed cameras, and night curfew.	
	Member for Mackay Nigel Dalton MP confirmed he had requested mobile noise detector; TMR can only test at approved facilities (not roadside) - further correspondence planned.	
	Marina Footpath Works	
	JMAC awarded construction tender; works expected to start early 2026.	
	Designs previously shared with CRG.	
	Communications plan being developed and will be rolled out before works commence. Lock of parking company reject on entry into breakwaters NORD advised featureth.	
	 Lack of parking concern raised on entry into breakwater; NQBP advised footpath improvements will better connect to existing car parks along Mulherin Drive, however additional parking is not within NQBP's scope

Shoreline Erosion Management Plan (SEMP) • Final draft of SEMP received from Alluvium; under review by NQBP. • NQBP will share draft with Mackay Regional Council and Department of Environment, Tourism, Science and Innovation end Nov/early Dec.

		 AEC conducted survey of 600 Mackay residents (May–June 2025) with 95% confidence level. Awareness: NQBP 63%, Mackay Port 59%, Hay Point 58%. 94% expect NQBP to undertake community initiatives; 79% support boosting coal trade; 19% concerned about port impacts. Key issues: roads (27%), housing (21%), infrastructure (15%), recreation (15%), cost of living (14%). Opportunities identified for targeted engagement with younger demographics, women, and new residents.

	Response – The CEO and Chair met with the petition organisers during the recent Community Cabinet meeting. They have been advised that under the current Master Plan for the port the area they are seeking to use is designated as Port, Industry and Commerce precinct which supports port operations, commodity handling, industry, port-related commercial activities and other related development. Recreational boating facilities are not consistent with this designation. In addition, the area is within the regulated port security boundary. As we've discussed, this area is earmarked for key future trade opportunities. We have provided briefings to the Member for Mackay and the relevant Ministerial departments.
