At this stage, we are not considering this. We understand that many community members appreciate being able to access the breakwater in cars due to physical disabilities etc. and to date have not received any reports of safety incidents between pedestrians / vehicles.</li> <li>NQBP was asked to install lighting in the rotundas at Old Mulherin Park. NQBP Operations	Presented by General Manager Trade and Marine Operations Brendan Webb  Trade figures and end of financial year results  • Port of Mackay had recorded 3.1Mt trade throughput for 2019-20.  • This is the Port's second-best result.  • In 2019-20 there were 11 RORO vessels, demonstrating new monthly trade route.  Washdown facility test run  • New, larger washdown facility has been completed at the Port, expanding our capabilities.  • Modernises the washing down and storing of imported goods subject to biosecurity controls.  • Supports future growth in the mining and agricultural machinery market.	
		<ul> <li>Container cargo through Port of Mackay</li> <li>The final batch of container cargo in support of a BMA project to decommission a trestle and conveyor from the Hay Point Coal Terminal will be transported to the Port of Mackay between 5-7 August 2020.</li> <li>Over 300 containers in total to be transported to Indonesia this month.</li> </ul>	



	Question – Have there been any passenger vessels in at the Port of Mackay?  Response – No passenger vessels have come into the Port. There was a vessel transporting two ex- Sydney passenger ferries on top of the deck, so may have looked like a passenger ferry.

NQBP Projects	<ul> <li>Presented by General Manager Infrastructure and Land Operations Tim Lewis</li> <li>Engineering Focus for FY 2020-21 <ul> <li>Mackay Tug Berths –New design being finalised and will then go out to tender.</li> <li>Western Revetment – Stabilisation works to improve safety.</li> <li>Wharf 4 eastern access deck replacement –Received tenders and evaluating, will allow for larger (in weight and width) RORO vessels.</li> <li>Wharf 1 extension – Currently out to tender. Will allow Port to accept over length cargoes between 85-95 metres in length.</li> <li>Maintenance dredging.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	
	<ul> <li>Recently completed projects</li> <li>Powerlines and water mains project – undergrounding of powerlines allows for free movement of cargoes around the Port. 6. Environmental update	the Northern Breakwater.  Presented by Director Environment Kevin Kane  Port of Mackay maintenance dredging project  NQBP will undertake essential maintenance dredging at the Port in September 2020.  First-time since 2013, as NQBP has been able to manage with bed-levelling until now.  Dredging will take up to fourteen days.	ACTION – NQBP to email to CRG to seek representative for TACC. ACTION – NQBP

NQBP has the State and Commonwealth maintenance dredging permits.

- NQBP staff and contractors will be working within these permits which outline strict environmental conditions.
- Communications and engagement plan has been developed and is under final review.
- NQBP will be engaging with key stakeholders including the Mackay Technical Advisory and Consultative Committee (TACC) as the project progresses. Members of the TACC include conservation groups, Traditional Owners, scientists, CRG member, port users and Commonwealth and State governments.
- A nomination from the CRG is needed, further details will be distributed to CRG.

Question – Where will the dredge material be relocated to?

Response – There is an approved at-sea dredge material placement area approx. 2 nautical miles off Slade Islet. Extremely fine silt so the material can't be placed on land.

Question – Could we see the same issues around fishing as the Port of Gladstone? Response - Very low risk. NQBP has lots of water, coral and seagrass quality monitoring in place and use this data to detect/manage any issues.

## Conservation/buffer areas

- There are buffer/conservation areas on NQBP landholdings at a number of our ports.
- These areas are protected through statutory land use plans, developed under *Transport Infrastructure Act 1994.*
- NQBP is responsible for ongoing weed management with all activity conducted in accordance with Weed Management Plans.
- NQBP will not gift these areas to the community as it is important they are maintained as a buffer between Port operations and residents and NQBP is responsible for the maintenance and liability for these areas.
