Results continue to be impacted by COVID-19. Coal prices are at a strong level at present.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Proposed hydrogen trade at Port of Hay Point is continuing to progress with funding agreement for feasibility studies associated with development of Dalrymple Bay Hydrogen Project recently announced.</li> </ul>

NQBP Infrastructure Update	Presented by General Manager Infrastructure, Tim Lewis  Maintenance and projects update  Louisa Creek property demolition works  Contract to be awarded and announced in the week ending 18 March.  Works to commence at the end of March, weather permitting.  Louisa Creek residents will be kept informed of the works via letterbox drop, emails to CRG members, and CRG meetings.  Hay Point administration building upgrade  Project is now complete; minor works being conducted as part of commissioning.  Works included demolition of aged concrete water tank beside building, removal of external sheeting (asbestos material) and some internal concrete block walls.  Public lookout area/toilets also refurbished.  Vessel Traffic Services and pilots to return to the building by the end of April.  68 local jobs supported.  Question – Is the lookout open?  Response – Yes, the public lookout is open and we'll confirm this in our 'end of works' communications to stakeholders, which includes an email to the CRG.

Preliminary data has revealed interesting insights into fish behaviour, and oyster/coral habitats.</li> </ul>
