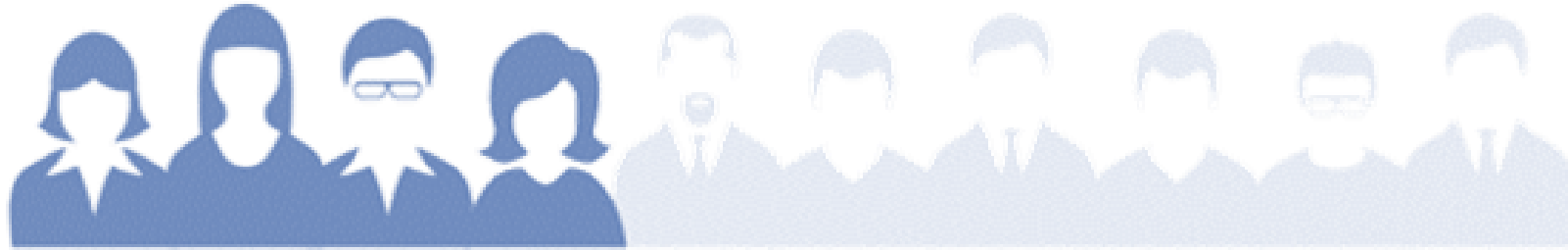

TRADE PERFORMANCE

- 30,000 tonnes of rail line imported from Whyalla, South Australia over the past few months. A further 2,000 tonnes to come over next six months. Galilee Basin bound, connect with Goonyella Line.
- December 2020 – 40 Martinus ballast wagons imported from China.
- February 2021 – Austin Engineering ULTIMA flow control bodies were offloaded and installed on Komatsu 830E-5 series trucks.
- February 2021 – Export of a fleet of second hand mining equipment to Port Hedland.
- April 2021 – Large mining equipment shipment from Chile will be discharged, washed and biosecurity inspected before delivery.

Trade figures (as at 8 March):

- Port of Hay Point – 64Mt
- Port of Mackay - 2Mt
- Port of Abbot Point – 19Mt
- Port of Weipa – 11Mt

MAJOR WORKS UPDATE

Wharf 4 access deck upgrade

- Status - Project completed.
- \$1.8 million upgrade, new deck load capacity increased to more than 100 tonnes.
- First RoRo shipment completed January.
- ~ 100 jobs supported.

Western Revetment

- Status - Project completed.
- \$1.5 million stabilisation works.
- ~ 15 jobs supported.

Wharf 1 extension

- Status – Works underway.
- \$2.5 million project – will allow facilitation of longer cargo
- Contract awarded to Davbridge Constructions.

Tug berth facility

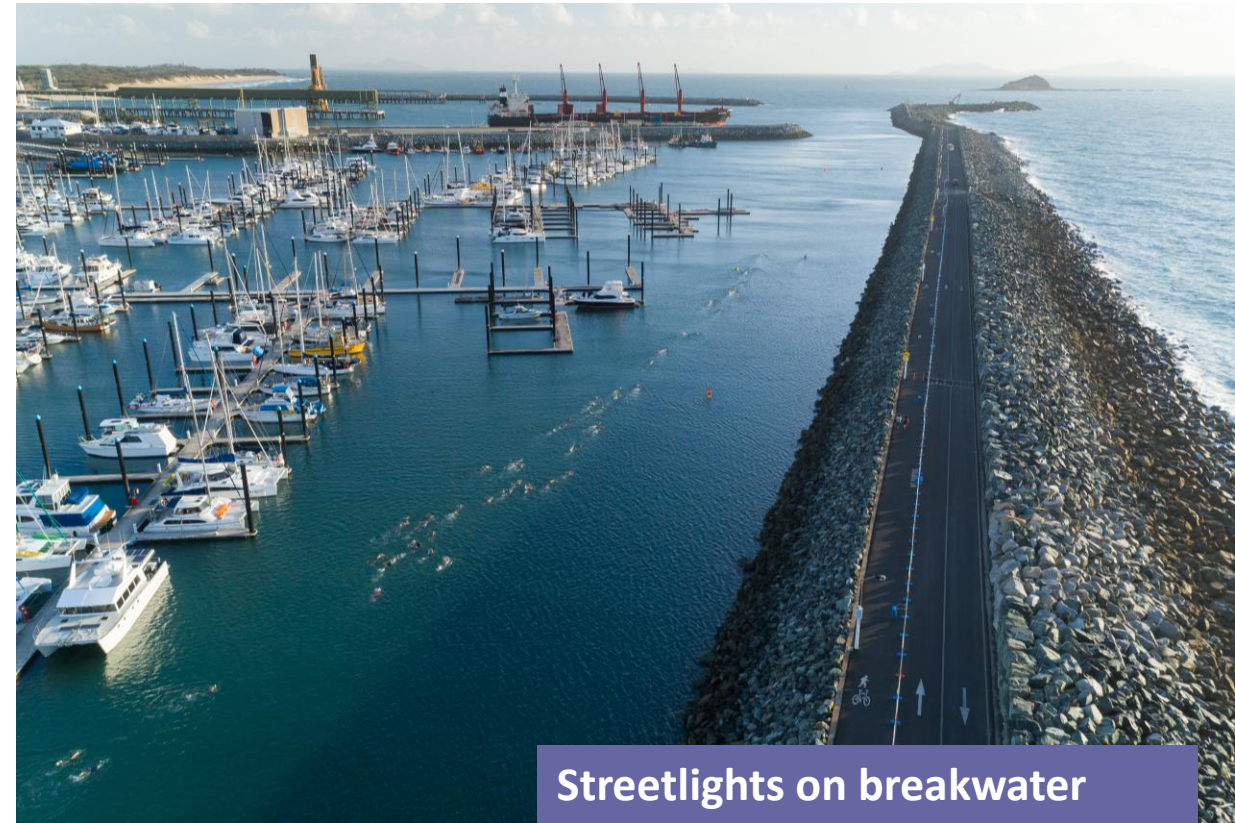
- Status – Works underway.
- \$8.5 million project will include berths for up to two tugs including a gangway and floating pontoon.
- Contract awarded to Pacific Marine Group, supporting ~20 jobs during project peak.

JCU PARTNERSHIP



- First undergraduate scholarship has been awarded.
- Intern program - three students have worked alongside our environment team in 2021.
- Work experience included marine pest DNA retrieval, Traditional Owner stakeholder engagement in Bowen and legislation and environmental management-associated practices.
- NQBP is working with JCU to shape future intern program alongside JCU Marine Science Masters graduate, a past intern.



MACKAY MAINTENANCE DREDGING

- NQBP successfully completed maintenance dredging at the Port of Mackay in December 2020.
- ~140,000m³ natural sediment removed and placed at the approved Dredge Material Placement Area.
- No incidents recorded.
- Communications and engagement plan was successfully rolled out with support from Volunteer Marine Rescue and Mackay Marina.
- No community complaints / issues recorded.



Dredging works set for port

A MAINTENANCE dredging project supporting 20 jobs at the Port of Mackay will begin next week.

It will be the first time North Queensland Bulk Ports Corporation has conducted maintenance dredging at the port since 2013.

It is part of a \$17m suite of infrastructure projects to occur over the next 12 months at the bustling Mackay port.

The task ensures Mackay waters remain safe and navigable by maintaining port infrastructure.

Mackay MP Julieanne Gilbert said it was a vital update for the port, which had 195 shipping movements during the financial year, recording its second-best result of 3.17 million throughput tonnes.

RESIDENTS wanting a say on the future and operations at the Ports of Mackay and Hay Point are encouraged to step up. Nominations are open for positions on the North Queensland Bulk Ports Corporation community reference groups.

Mackay MP Julieanne Gilbert said

the reference groups, which have been running for almost 20 years, provided an invaluable link between the port authority and its communities.

"The Port of Mackay and Hay Point are critical to around 22,000 Queensland jobs in mining, agriculture and logistics and facilitates \$1.8 billion of trade worldwide," Mrs Gilbert said.

"Making sure our communities and ports flourish through continued investment is crucial to creating jobs

as part of Queensland's plan for economic recovery through COVID-19."

NQBP chief executive Nicolas Fertin said the groups provided a forum for discussions and raising issues relating to port operations and development.

"(The groups) enable members to provide feedback, raise any concerns and to share how we can work together to improve our port communities," Mr Fertin said.

Six positions, including three community representatives, one local marina resident and two recreational group (boating, surfing or fishing) representatives, are available on the Port of Mackay CRG.

Eight positions are available for community representatives and interest group representatives on the Port of Hay Point CRG.

Mackay Deputy Mayor Karen May encouraged community members to apply for a role.


