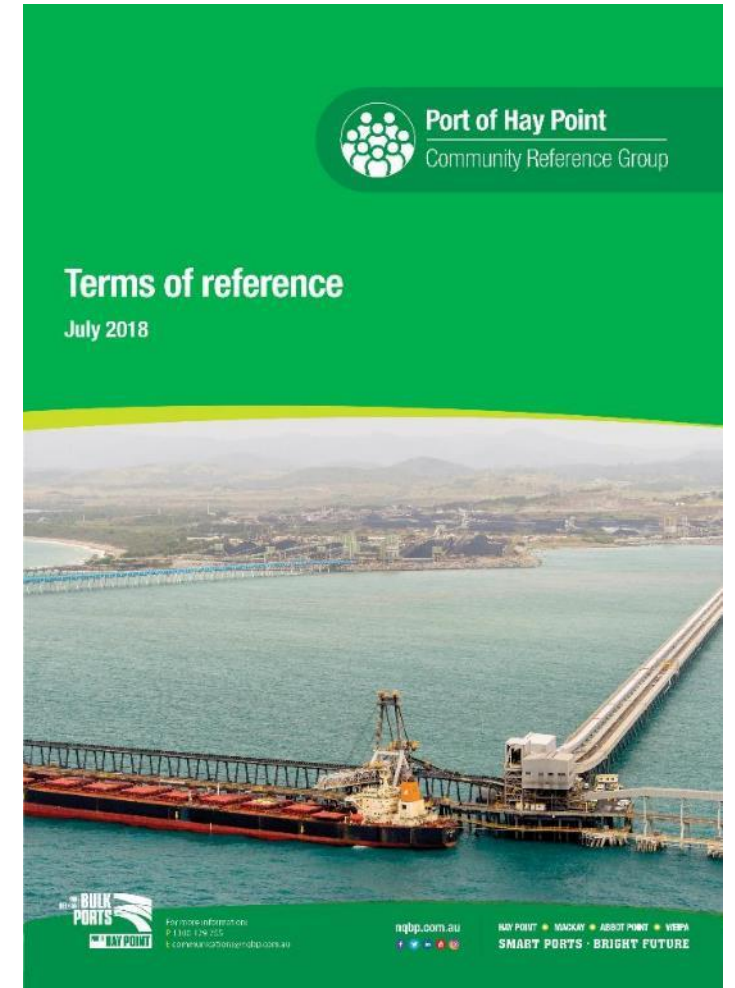

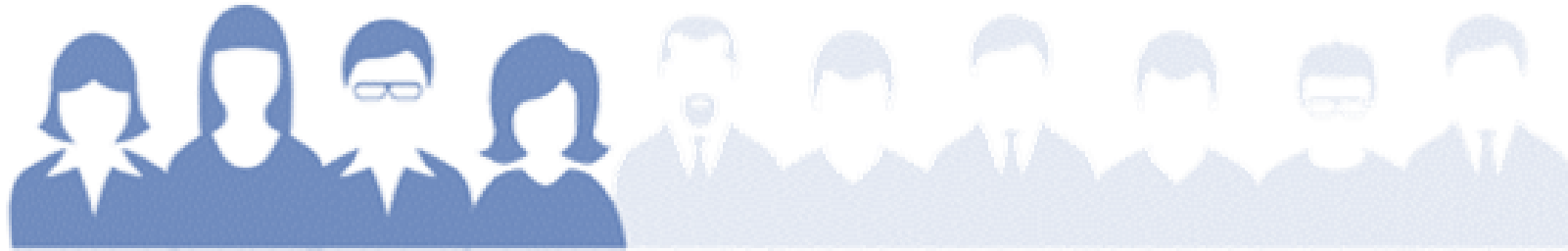

- ✓ **Dec 2020 – Port of Mackay’s Wharf 1 extension announced – a \$2.4m project.**
 - Will improve infrastructure capability to handle extra-long (up to 95m) cargoes.
 - 30 local jobs from around 15 local businesses.
 - Approx. six months to complete.
- ✓ **Feb 2021 – new \$8.5m tug berth facility announced.**
 - 20 jobs during peak of project.
- ✓ **Feb 2021 – LNG-powered bulk carrier ‘HL Eco’ (pictured right) berthed at Port of Hay Point during maiden voyage from Newcastle to Korea.**
 - World’s largest LNG-powered carrier - capacity of 180,000 t and a length of 292m.
 - Will produce 30% less greenhouse gases than fuel-powered ship.

Trade figures – 2020-21 (as at 8 March):

- Port of Hay Point - 64Mt
- Port of Mackay - 2Mt
- Port of Abbot Point – 19Mt
- Port of Weipa – 11Mt

HAY POINT ADMINISTRATION BUILDING UPGRADE

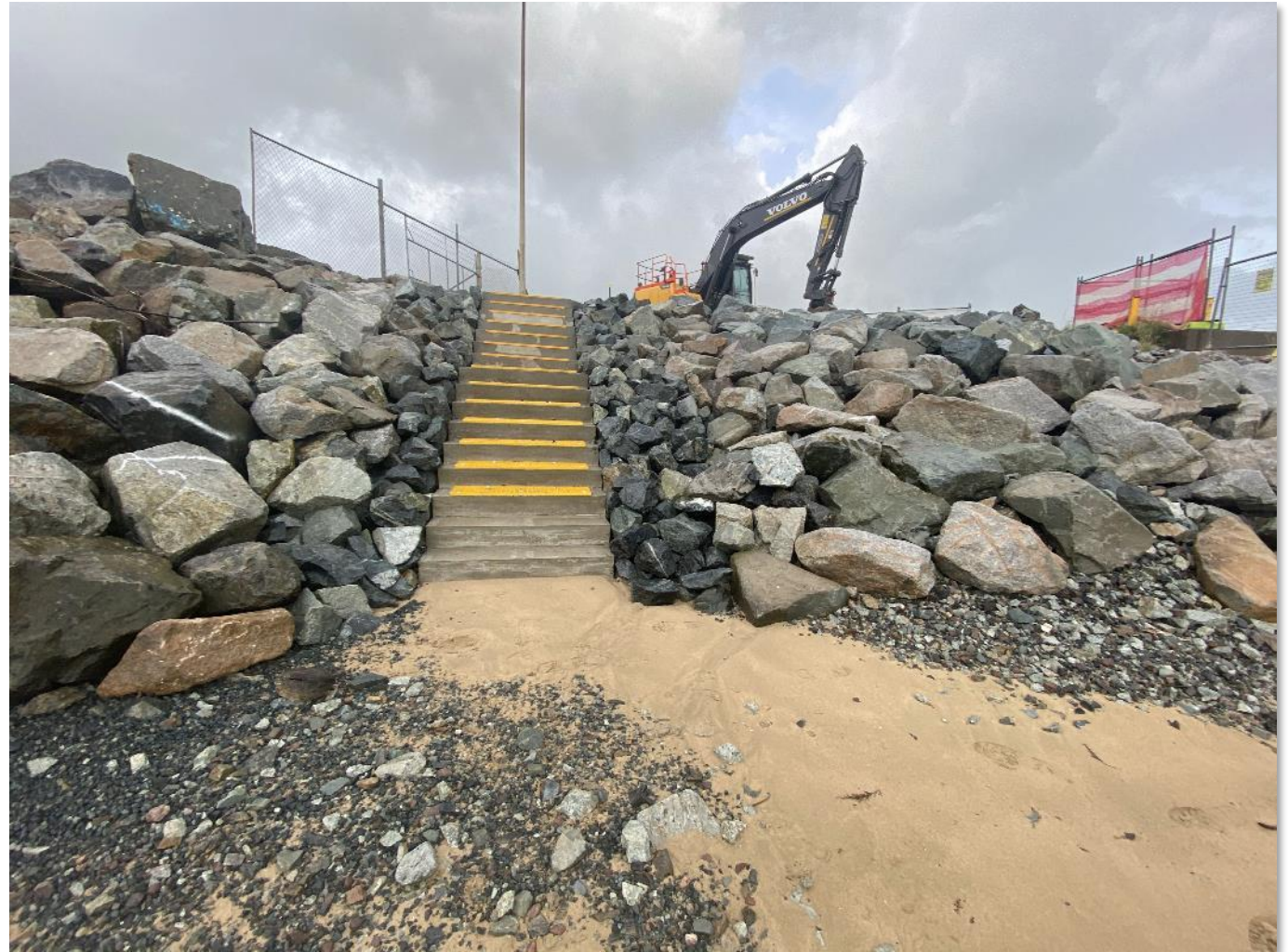
- Early Dec 2020 – NQBP announced awarded contract.
- Jan 2021 – Works commenced.
 - Includes refurbishment and upgrade of the interior fit outs and utilities.
- Ground floor and half of first floor to be completed by end of April / early May.
- Duration of works - approx. 9 months (weather permitting). Currently on track.
- Key stakeholders will be kept informed of any updates.



Internal fit outs continue at Hay Point Administration Building.

HALF TIDE STEPS

- Early Jan 2021 – works commenced.
- The steps have been poured and cured.
- Associated works adjacent to the steps are continuing – i.e. placement of rock, concrete path to steps.
- Construction expected to be completed by end of March.

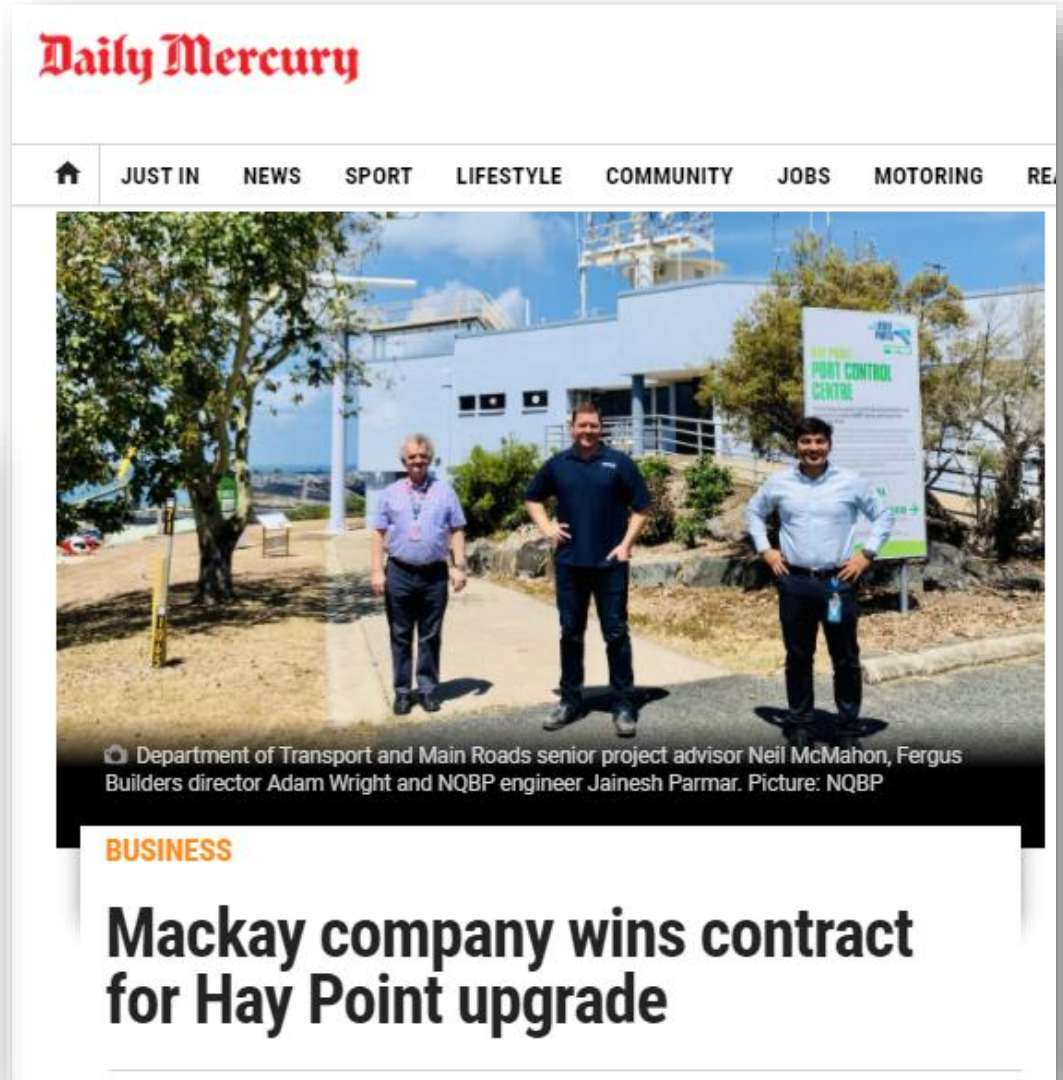
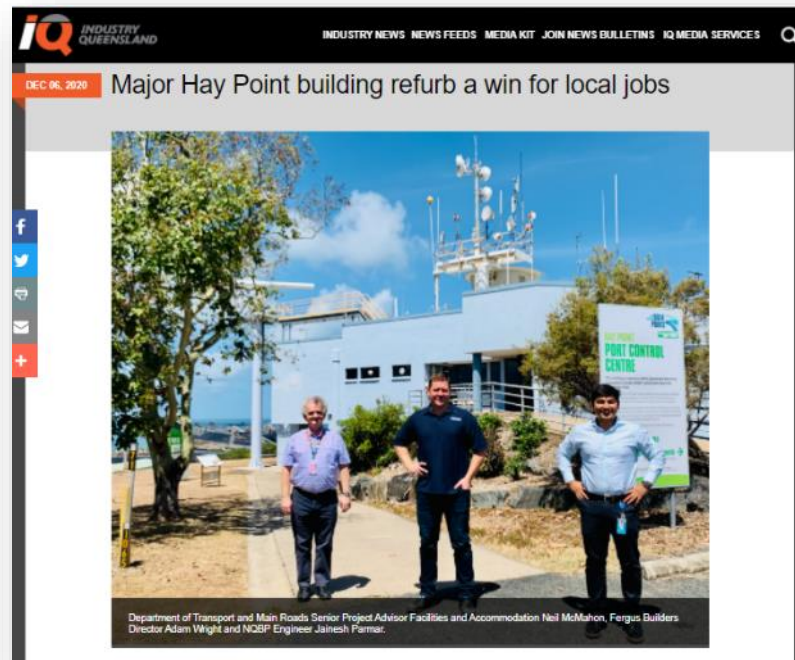

MACKAY

FERGUS Builders has been named the principal contractor for a refurbishment project at the Port of Hay Point.

Home to Maritime Safety Queensland's Vessel Traffic Services and North Queensland Bulk Port's marine pilots, the project will include the refurbishment and upgrade of internal fixtures and amenities of an administration building.

NQBP chief executive Nicolas Fertin said the project would extend the life of the building.

RESIDENTS wanting a say on the future and operations at the Ports of Mackay and Hay Point are encouraged to step up. Nominations are open for positions on the North Queensland Bulk Ports Corporation community reference groups.

Mackay MP Julieanne Gilbert said

the reference groups, which have been running for almost 20 years, provided an invaluable link between the port authority and its communities.

"The Port of Mackay and Hay Point are critical to around 22,000 Queensland jobs in mining, agriculture and logistics and facilitates \$1.8 billion of trade worldwide," Mrs Gilbert said.

"Making sure our communities and ports flourish through continued investment is crucial to creating jobs

as part of Queensland's plan for economic recovery through COVID-19."

NQBP chief executive Nicolas Fertin said the groups provided a forum for discussions and raising issues relating to port operations and development.

"(The groups) enable members to provide feedback, raise any concerns and to share how we can work together to improve our port communities," Mr Fertin said.

Six positions, including three community representatives, one local marina resident and two recreational group (boating, surfing or fishing) representatives, are available on the Port of Mackay CRG.

Eight positions are available for community representatives and interest group representatives on the Port of Hay Point CRG.

Mackay Deputy Mayor Karen May encouraged community members to apply for a role.


