NQBP Overview	<ul> <li>Presented by CEO (Chair), Nicolas Fertin</li> <li>International Women's Day <ul> <li>Nicolas acknowledged International Women's Day and the various activities taking place at NQBP work sites and across the region.</li> <li>There is progress in gender diversity and equality being made at NQBP and across the port industry.</li> <li>For example, there were no female CEOs in the Australian port industry five years ago. Today, among the 22 Port Authority CEO's, two are female.</li> <li>At NQBP: <ul> <li>Three out of five Board directors are women.</li> <li>In the last two years, the 22 Executive and Senior Manager positions saw the number of female leaders triple from 2 to 6.</li> <li>Across the entire business, NQBP has approximately 40% representation of female employees in various positions and a growing number of women in historically maledominated roles.</li> </ul> </li> </ul></li></ul>
