Harbour Beach clean up



- In May 2025, NQBP led a major debris removal operation at Mackay's Harbour Beach following damage from tropical weather events.
- NQBP worked with Mackay
 Regional Council and Mackay
 Surf Lifesaving Club to facilitate access.
- In four days, more than 55 truckloads of material were cleared across 680 metres of coastline.



Southern Breakwater proposed changes



Traffic Engineering options assessment recommended:

- New / updated signage (speed, no parking)
- Removing raised concrete edges on entry
- Additional lighting
- Line-marking
- New edge lines
- Additional / changed speed humps
- Inclusion of disability parking
- New turnaround facility
- Installation of kerb separators
- Curve widening
- Better separation between cyclists and pedestrians




Southern Breakwater proposed changes







Southern Breakwater entrance

- New permanent signage entry signage being drafted.
- In addition to electronic noticeboard.
- Changes still be made to draft signage:
 - Add Qld Road Rules apply wording
 - Add Call 000 for emergencies
 - Report behaviours to QPS
 - Colour changes
 - Change from Mackay Breakwater to Southern Breakwater


The Sydney Star arrives in the harbour for the opening ceremony, 26 August 1939.

Container trade

Project covers:


- Design and construction of a container laydown area
- Implementation of upgraded quarantine and biosecurity facilities, procedures, and measures to allow for importation of containers and mining tyres
- Design and implementation of an appropriate operating model.






DUKC for Mackay

- DUKC being implemented in Mackay.
- DUKC calculates the under-keel clearance of each ship in real-time as it travels, using ship modelling and real-time tidal info.
- Benefits:
 - More accurate data
 - Increased sailing drafts and sailing windows while reducing navigational risk. A deeper draft equals more capacity.
 - Reduced dredging, fuel use and greenhouse gas emissions
- Installation of pile for wave-rider.

Shoreline Erosion Management Plan (SEMP)

Purpose:

- Provide direction for the management of key parts of the coastline in the immediate to short-term (up to 20 years) planning horizon.
- Address concerns from the community recreational access, increasing erosion to beach and dunes, and potential impacts to turtle nesting.
- Address erosion issues adjacent to North Wall recreational area and planned upgrades.






Shoreline Erosion Management Plan

Coastal Processes & Shoreline Condition Assessment

- Predominant SE waves and northward flushing ebb tide.
- Sediment transport estimated at around 36,000m³/year northward.
- Accretion of transported sediment along South Harbour Beach.
- Some sand bypassing of harbour entrance.
- Fate of bypassing sand likely arriving further north of North Wall Beach due to shadowing.
- Loss of beach buffer (wide foredune area, reduces beach access and amenity).

Preliminary Options Assessment

- 'Hard' & 'soft' options
- Established draft assessment criteria:
 - Accessibility
 - Adaptability
 - Cultural heritage
 - Protection and durability
 - Environmental
 - Approvals
 - Safety
 - Value (cost)
 - Visual amenity
 - Community
- Additional modelling of soft options (beach nourishment) completed
- Forms basis for stakeholder workshop



Ambient Marine Monitoring Program


- Completed as part of JCU/NQBP Partnership
- Focused on:
 - Seagrass
 - Coral Slade, Round Top and Victor Islands
 - Marine water quality
- Purpose is to understand condition and track trends over time.
- Technical reports available on NQBP website
- Public dashboards also available on NQBP website.



Biosecurity / invasive pests

- International trade can bring hitch-hiker risks in cargo, crew, waste, and ballast.
- Biosecurity Queensland (Department of Agriculture and Fisheries) has lead role - NQBP has early detection, first strike and support role
- Current risks and monitoring
 - Varroa mite affects European honeybees
 - Invasive ants Fire ants, Electric ants, Yellow crazy ants
 - Marine pests surveys target 7 high-risk species
 - Invasive animals include foxes, feral pigs, and cats
 - Early detection monitoring for invasive marine species, bees, ants, toads
- Eradication programs (feral animals)
- NQBP Biosecurity Washdown Facility
